

Title : SAFEGUARDING THE DEMENTIA PATIENTS IN A CARE HOME

Introduction

Vulnerability is the prime concern that is associated with the dementia patient and it is the major significant responsibility of a care home is to safeguard the vulnerable adults in an appropriate manner so as to reduce the risks associated with them. This assignment is critically going to analyse the topic of safeguarding the patients with dementia in a care home. Three preliminary aspects are going to be evaluated herewith this assignment namely the political drivers that influence the contemporary issue, the societal driver as well as the service provision that is related to the safeguarding of the dementia patients within the care organisation. Moreover, the esteemed role of the nurses will be understood for recognising and looking into the matter of abuse in the care homes.

Overview of safeguarding existence

As per the definition stated by the Care Quality Commission (CQC), safeguarding is considered to be the appropriate measures taken by the care homes in order to protect the *wellbeing of the vulnerable patients, creating allowance for their safe neglect free living and promoting human rights for the mitigation of harm and abuse* (Care Home UK, 2020). Safeguarding acts to be very significant for the vulnerable individuals with dementia due to the large number of associated concerns regarding neglect as the individuals with dementia tend to develop symptoms like memory loss, confusion, low mood, cognitive impairment and so on. Existence of safeguard in every individual care home is essential as these safeguarding policies help to provide support to the affected individuals who are a *victim of abuse and neglect*. Due to the loss of memory and confusion among the individual

patients it has been reported that a large number of victims those are neglected in a worse manner forget to file a report and thus it is to be mentioned that the existence of safeguarding is necessary to promote a healthy and happier life for those dementia patients (UK community care, 2020).

Significance of safeguarding the dementia patient

Safeguarding is important for the people with dementia for providing a better ambience to the patients in the care homes as it has been seen that those individuals lack effective decision making ability and due to their incompetent mental capacity they are abused and discouraged by disparaging remarks. As per the researchers it has been seen that the vulnerable people with dementia are projected to hinder and they remain in a state of confusion regarding the things that are going around them and in such case safeguarding is a necessity for reducing the risks that are laid over those individuals (Alzheimer UK, 2020). Abuses occur in different forms such as *physical, mental, emotional abuse* and many more that puts the life of a dementia patient in a distressing condition and in such a state safeguarding are said to be significant as they not only support the affected individual but encourage them to fight back in an effective manner. It is also to be noted that safeguarding acts as a preventive measure by helping the individuals with dementia before harm occurs to them (Preston-Shoot, 2017, p.34).
